BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT - CITY OF RACINE

WHAT ARE "BROWNFIELDS?"

Brownfields are abandoned, idle or underused industrial or commercial properties where redevelopment is hindered by known or suspected contamination.

The purpose of this document is to serve as a guide to the redevelopment a brownfield site within the City of Racine.

Once you have identified a site and developed a plan for its reuse, you should engage the City of Racine in the planning of the redevelopment effort.

DEPARTMENT OF CITY DEVELOPMENT

Your first call should be to the Department of City Development. They will assist in outlining the City permitting process for the site based on planned use and zoning. This will help you develop a timetable based on any committee approvals you may need to obtain. The Department of City Development is located in Room 102 at City Hall and can be reached at:


